Introduction of recycling Program

BCCC Administration will launch its college-wide recycling program with an expanded list of Acceptable materials at BCCC Campuses.

Larger containers will be placed in designated areas in each building and a desktop recycling box placed on your desk for Acceptable Recycling Materials.

Take a moment to review the list of acceptable materials below:

Acceptable Recycling:

1. Flattened cardboard
2. Brown Paper Bags
3. Magazine/Newspaper
4. Office Paper
5. Plastic/Glass and Jar
6. Junk Mail
7. Phone Books
8. Aluminum Cans /foil
9. Paper board
10. Steel Can
11. Empty Aerosol Cans

The following items are not to be discarded in the recycling Bins:

1. Garbage
2. Plastic Bags
3. Plastic Tubs

How does my recycling get from my office to the loading Dock where it is picked up?

The BCCC staffs are responsible for emptying their desktop recycling boxes into the larger recycling containers located in designated area in the building. A member of the environmental service staff will pick up the large containers from the designated space dump it and return the empty container to the original space.

WHY Recycle?

Recycling reduce the number of trees cut down to make paper, reduce the amount of petroleum used to make plastics and reduce the amount of space needed for landfills just to name a few things.
