

PREQUALIFICATION FACT SHEET FOR CONSULTANTS



Who must be Prequalified?

All architecture, landscape architecture, engineering and surveying firms intending to perform professional services for the City of Baltimore on contracts totaling \$50,000 or greater.

Who approves Prequalification?

OBC recommends contractors for approval. The City's Board of Estimates grants final approval.

Difference Between Prequalification and M/WBE Certification?:

A Prequalification Certificate verifies a contractor's ability to perform contracted work through reviewing its professional experience and financial capacity. M/WBE Certification is a process whereby the Minority and Women's Business Opportunity Office (MWBOO) in the City's Law Department verifies the legitimacy of a firm seeking a City classification as an Minority- and/or Woman-Owned Enterprise. When must a contractor be prequalified?

Prime contractors AND Subcontractors must be prequalified <u>at the time of proposal</u> submittal.

Where to apply for prequalification?

Submit a completed Consultant Application (SF254) and appropriate documentation to:

Is there a fee?

Currently, there is no cost to become prequalified.

How long is the pregualification process start to finish?

Consultants should allow a minimum of 30 days for OBC to fully review applications. An incomplete application is a primary cause for delay.

<u>Length of approval per prequalification period and renewal frequency thereafter:</u>

One year from BOE approval date. Prequalification renewal is required on an annual

basis.
