E. Inspection Findings

- During a utility inspection for the Developers Agreement for Kloman Street, there were two pumps actively pumping sediment laden water without filter bags. Sediment laden water was flowing down a walking path and into an unprotected inlet. (FINES ISSUED)
 - a. Pumping Sediment Laden Water without Filter Bags x 2 @ \$100.00 Total \$200.00
 - b. Sediment Laden Water entering unprotected inlet x 1 @ \$100.00 Total \$100.00

Payment is due immediately upon receipt of this notice and should be made by means of a check made payable to the Director of Finance and submitted to the City of Baltimore, Department of Public Works Office of Research and Environmental Protection. 3001 Druid Park Dr. Room 228 Baltimore, MD 21215. Please note on the check that the check is for E&SC fines. Information on appealing the fines is found below









2. Please install inlet protection and pump into filter bags. Each hose should have its own filter bag.



- 3. Tracking of onsite soils onto existing roadways surrounding the project is strictly prohibited and will be strictly enforced.
- 4. Concrete washout must be into an approved container or device.
- 5. Any inlet within or near active work zones must be protected.
- 6. Any disturbed areas not actively being worked on must be temporarily stabilized within 7 days.
- 7. All pumped water must be through an approved sediment control device.
- 8. Work is expected to commence Mid 2024 and is expected to continue throughout 2025.
- 9. Contractor to inspect controls periodically and after major storm events and maintain as required.
- 10. All controls must remain in place and be maintained until the site reaches 95% stabilization and the inspector has given permission to remove the controls.

F. Corrective Actions

1. Items 1 and 2 must be corrected immediately. Due to the nature of this violation, penalty fines have been issued at a rate of \$100 / per infraction for a total of \$300.00.

Per Article 7, Division III, Subtitle 35 of the City Code, any ESC violation notice may be appealed and eligible for administrative review. **Any appeal must be submitted in writing within 10 days of the inspection report.** The appeal may be submitted to the Director of Public Works via email DPWDirector@baltimorecity.gov (preferred) or Baltimore City DPW, Abel Wolman Building, 6th Floor, Attn: ESC Appeals, 200 N. Holliday Street, Baltimore, 21202. The written appeal must include:

- Project Name, DPW ID, and inspection date as listed on page 1 of this inspection report.
- A statement of the legal ground on which the appeal is based; and
- An express statement of any desire for an administrative hearing.
