

OFFICE OF BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS (OBC) PREQUALIFICATION FACT SHEET FOR CONSULTANTS



Who must be Prequalified?

<u>All firms</u> must complete the Standard Form (SF) 254 Architect-Engineer and Related Services Questionnaire even those not found under the categories for the following: Architecture, Construction Management, Engineering, Landscape Architecture, Property Line Survey, Surveying Firms and Consultants for Related Services intending to bid and provide professional services for the City of Baltimore on contracts in the amount of \$50,000 or greater.

Who approves Prequalification?

- OBC provides recommendation of a firms' approval.
- The City's Board of Estimates (BOE) grants final approval.

Difference between Prequalification and M/WBE Certification:

- <u>Prequalification Certificate</u> verifies a firm's ability to self-perform their work, through review of its professional experience and backlog of existing contracted work.
- M/WBE Certification is a process whereby the Minority and Women's Business
 Opportunity Office (MWBOO) in the City's Law Department verifies the
 legitimacy of a firm seeking a City classification as a Minority- and/or Woman Owned Enterprise. MWBOO can be reached at 410-396-4355 and or:

When must a consultant be prequalified?

 Prime Consultants AND Subcontractors firms must be prequalified <u>at the time</u> of proposal submittal.

Where can you apply for pregualification?

Submit a completed Consultant Application (SF254) and appropriate documentation to: Office of Boards and Commissions

Is there a fee?

• Currently, there is no fee for consultants to become prequalified.

How long is the prequalification process start to finish?

Consultants should allow a minimum of 35 <u>business</u> days for all applications.

An incomplete application and references are the primary cause for delay.

How often am I required to renew my prequalification?

Prequalification for **Consulting** Firms **expires One (1) year** from BOE approval date. Prequalification for a **Consulting** Firms **renewal** is required annually.
