



Sanitary Contract SC956 (Sanitary Sewer Collection System Improvements to the High Level Sewershed)

To Whom It May Concern,

Below is the project construction status update. As of the writing of this memo the Project stands at 100% complete of the Contract’s scope of work. The Contractor has completing punch list items for corrections to work already performed, but major disturbances for work under the project’s scope are not to be expected.

The purpose of this project is to:

- Repair the aging sewer system
- Prevent sewer back-ups into private property
- Reduce/eliminate sewer overflows
- Improve sewage flows and pipe capacity

Project Work has been completed


- **Restoration Work (Paving Repair and Soil Stabilization)**
 - York Road and Evesham Avenue (MTA Stop)

Although the work occurring at this location as shown in the photo below was not part of Sewer Project, SC956, the disturbed area is adjacent to our worksite and involved the emergency repair of the existing water main which has an impact on our work. The repair to the water main involved removal of the brick paving and leaving a temporary asphalt patch to be restored to the original condition later. When brought to SC956’s Project Manager attention that the brick pavers were still onsite and presented a potential hazard to citizens utilizing the bus stop we arranged to have the material to be stored offsite until such a time that full restoration and stabilization could occur.
