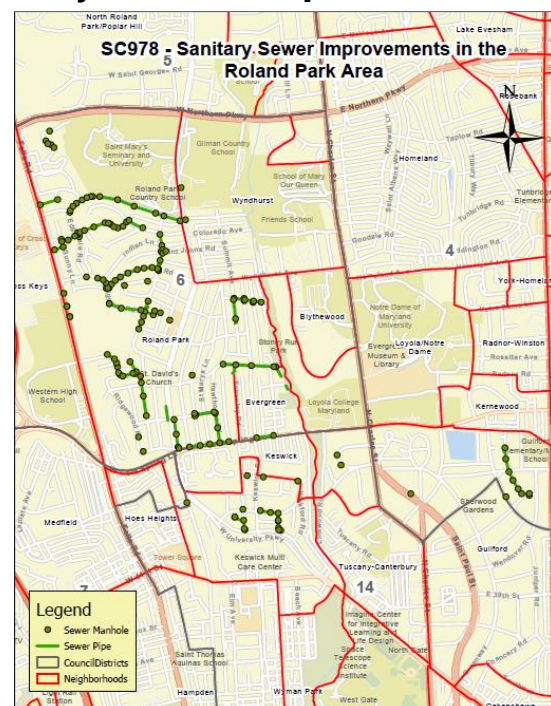
Small Diameter Sewer Main Replacement In The Roland Park Area Of The Jones Falls Sewershed

Project Purpose

This project will prevent Sanitary Sewer Overflows (SSO's), reduce infiltration and inflow, address capacity problems, and improve the overall condition of the aging sewer system utilizing the following corrective action:

- Sewer Rehabilitation
 - Cured-In-Place Pipe (CIPP) Lining
 - Pipe Replacement
 - Upsizing the existing 6-inch pipes to 8-inch and 10-inch pipes which will ultimately reduce inspection issues and also improve system capacity.
- Manhole Rehabilitation

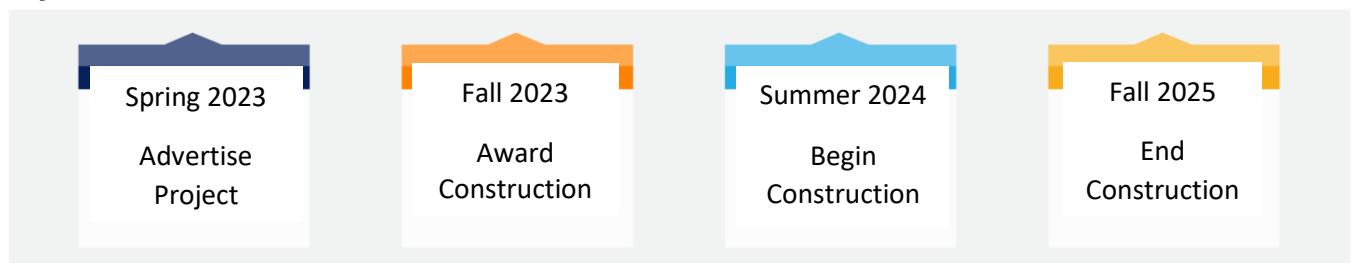
Project Area Map



Project History

After a 2009 Sewer Investigation Study, The City of Baltimore (City) identified the Roland Park area as having a large amount of 6" sewers. The City initiated the Small Sewer Main Assessment and Renewal Program to further evaluate the condition of those 6" sewers. SC978 was later developed to address the issues discovered during the evaluation, mainly capacity related issues resulting from aging infrastructure and root intrusion. The project scope was expanded due to a rise in reported SSO's.

- Cured-In-Place Pipe (CIPP) Lining (1500 LF)
- Open Cut Sewer Replacement (13,200 LF)
- Pipe Upsizing by Pipe Bursting (6"-8") (4420 LF)
- New Manhole Installation (580 VF)
- Existing Manholes Rehabilitation (207 EA)

Impact/Disruptions

- Notice to be provided to residents 72 hours prior to start of work
- Construction Hours, Weekdays, 7:00 AM – 5:00 PM, possibly after hour or weekend
- Temporary water use restrictions and odors possible when replacing sewer main
 - May be present, not harmful, running basement water in sink, open windows and doors
- Lane Closures / Road Detours, temporary parking restrictions, public transportation will be maintained
